COUNCIL WORK SESSION

MARCH 18, 2013

The March work session of the Forty Fort Borough Council was held on Monday, March 18, 2013 at the Forty Fort Borough Bldg., 1271 Wyoming Ave., Forty Fort with President Joseph Chacke presiding.

President Chacke called the meeting to order at 7:58 PM with the following members of council present: Robert Craig, Dorothy Craig, Charles Rick Kamus & Frank Michaels. Excused absences by Karen Martinelli & Betty Mascelli.

Also present were Mayor Boyd Hoats, Manager Barbara Fairchild & Secretary Bonnie Arnone.

President Chacke noted that an Executive Session had been held prior to this meeting this evening for personnel issues.

Jeff McLaughlin stated that he had brought to the attention of council before that there should be more of an explanation for Executives Sessions other than just personnel issues.

Mr. Kamus stated that he would like to see some other means to get rid of the leaves & yard waste that currently goes to Earth Conservancy. Some options were discussed.

Mrs. Craig stated that the pool prices had not been raised in several years and that it was time to do so.
